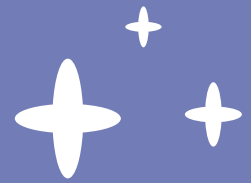

Our story



Quinn's Retreat was founded out of unimaginable loss and a powerful desire to help others.

After losing our beautiful 17 year old daughter Quinn to suicide in December 2018 we created a small memorial garden in her memory. During a deeply emotional family trip shortly after her funeral, we realised how healing it was to be together and away from the weight of daily life. It was there that the idea for Quinn's Retreat was born – to offer families bereaved by suicide a peaceful space to spend time, reflect, and begin to heal.

Tragically, just ten months later, we lost

our beloved 21 year old son Dyllon, to suicide. He had been Quinn's closest friend, and the burden of grief was too much for him to carry. His loss reaffirmed our mission.

In January 2020 Quinn's Retreat became a registered charity. By February we had purchased our first retreat space – a holiday caravan in Barnard Castle. In 2021 we added our second space near Appleby, lovingly named Dyl's Den.

Through these retreats we aim to provide solace, connection and compassion to families facing life after suicide loss.

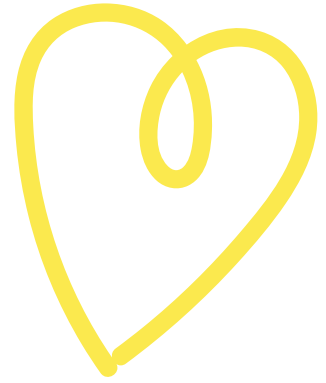

Our Vision and Mission



Our vision is safe havens for people bereaved to suicide.

Our mission at Quinn's Retreat is to support those bereaved by suicide, providing a safe space for a break away; an escape from the everyday, and a chance to reflect and remember. Created by people with lived experience, in memory of Dyllon and Quinn.

Why we are needed

The North East continues to record the highest suicide rate in the UK. The impact of suicide loss is far-reaching and often long-term:

- **Emotional and psychological effects:** Bereaved individuals commonly experience complex grief, trauma and PTSD. The risk of suicide among those affected is significantly increased.
- **Financial burden:** Families face sudden funeral expenses, legal and inquest-related costs, loss of income, and heightened risk of job loss or long-term financial insecurity.
- **Impact on children:** Children may suffer emotional trauma, develop mental health conditions, and face instability at home, affecting future outcomes.
- **Social consequences:** Suicide can fracture families and friendships, leading to isolation and weakened community ties. The stigma surrounding suicide may further marginalise those affected.
- **Physical health implications:** Grief and stress can worsen existing health conditions or lead to new issues such as insomnia, cardiovascular problems, or a weakened immune system.

Quinn's Retreat is a unique service, the only one we are aware of in the country



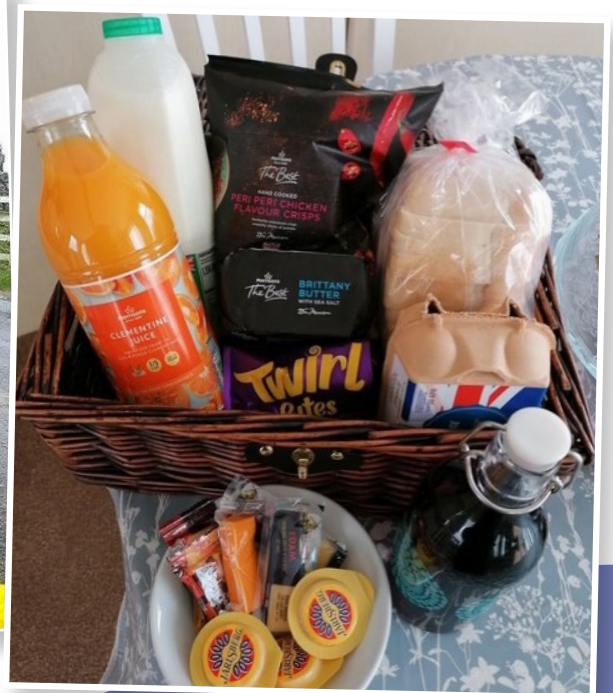

What Quinn's Retreat provides

- **A unique personalised community-driven compassionate intervention** where visitors feel valued, respected, included and accepted. Developed by a team with lived experience.
- **A week long respite away from daily challenges** in a supportive and nurturing environment, providing anonymity and privacy.
- **Access to beautiful, tranquil, green spaces & recreational areas** with the opportunity to engage in positive activities to improve physical health and mental wellbeing.
- **An opportunity to deepen social and family connections**, to build stronger relationships, improve social functioning and regain confidence.
- **The time and space to enhance emotional wellbeing**, decrease mental ill-health symptoms and create greater capacity to experience positive emotions.
- **Long-term benefits** may include stronger resilience, improved coping skills, and a deeper sense of hope, purpose, and direction



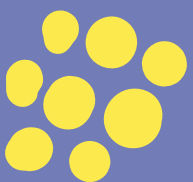

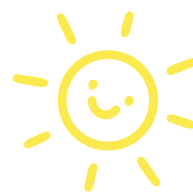

Who we'd like to help



Our holiday homes are hugely popular in the school holidays. We strive to fairly allocate but can't accommodate all who need our support.

Larger or extended families are a challenge to host, even in Dyl's Den, our bigger caravan.

Those in immediate need may have to wait some months for an available date.

Families may not have the funds to travel to our locations, especially without their own transport.

We cannot guarantee returners a break, given the increasing demand.

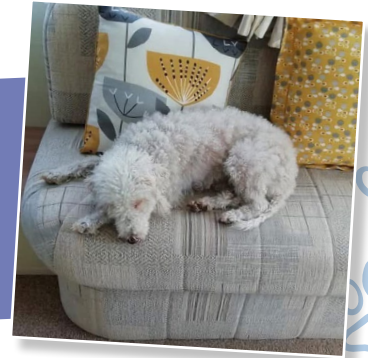

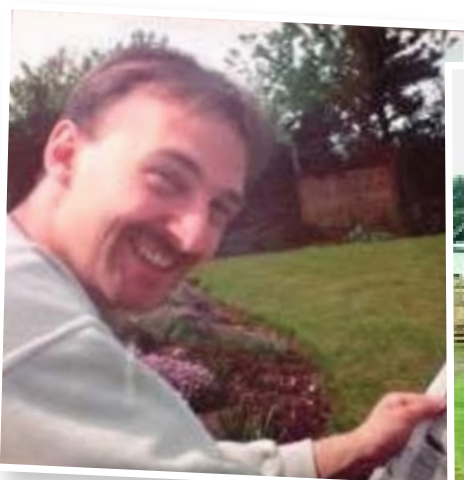

Our partnership:

The North East Speak Their Name Suicide Memorial Quilt



Tracey Beadle and Suzanne Howes of Quinn's Retreat led the project to create a lasting memorial, raising awareness as both a suicide prevention and postvention initiative.

200 people bereaved by suicide attended our community workshops across Tyne & Wear, County Durham, Darlington & Teesside.





An amazing artwork of 120 quilt squares across 3 panels were created, representing 77 people lost to suicide.

Our special launch event was held in Newcastle City library in November 2023.

Our video accompanying the quilt won a charity award.

Creating a legacy



Our quilt has toured 20 plus public venues across Tyne & Wear, County Durham & Darlington, with Teesside to follow into late 2026.

We have hosted many events, inviting the suicide bereaved & local community leaders & dignitaries.

300 people attended our suicide awareness & remembrance event at Newcastle Cathedral in March 2024.

We have contributed to conferences and strategy events across the region and wider.





The quilt was displayed at The Houses of Parliament in October 2025

An evaluation by NENC ICB* & Newcastle University found:

Those who made squares experienced healing, hope and reduced isolation through community connection and peer support.

Those viewing the quilt were profoundly moved, provoking thought, conversations and a desire to focus on both their own and others mental wellbeing

These findings were presented at The National Suicide Bereavement Conference.

700 books telling the story behind each square were distributed across our community.

Every MP, library, GP & crisis team has a copy. Newcastle Hospitals Charity enabled 500 books to be printed. CNTW* covered postage costs.

Next steps for Quinn's Retreat

- The demand for our respite breaks is increasing. We are at capacity and, to ensure fairness, we are limiting caravan bookings to **one holiday every two years per family**.
- School holidays are a struggle to **accommodate** with so many young families needing our support.
- We are exploring ways to expand our accommodation longer term. Ideally, we want to invest in **bricks-and-mortar accommodation** so we can offer more families the break they need and deserve year-round.
- We'd love a place by the coast, to complement our other locations. **Think Airbnb style quality with accessible public transport.**
- With the **right investment, we can grow our impact** and provide year-round access to safe, welcoming spaces.

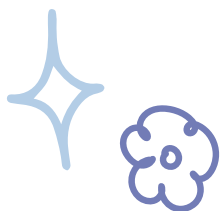

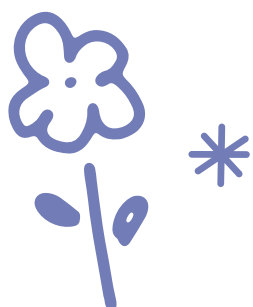
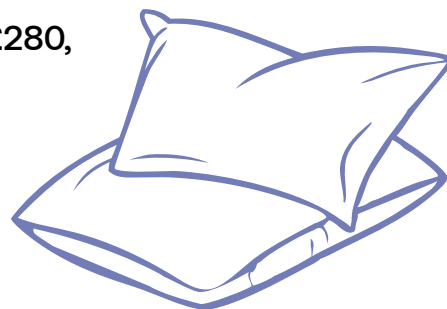
